

Den Chief

Job Description: The den chief works with the Cub Scouts, Webelos Scouts, and den leaders in a Cub Scout pack.

Reporting/Election: • Appointed by Assistant Scoutmaster responsible for working with Cub Scout in consultation with Cub Den Leader and the Scoutmaster • Reports to:

- (1) The den leader in the pack, and
- (2) Assistant Scoutmaster responsible for working with Cub Scout packs.

Duties:

- Knows the purposes of Cub Scouting.
- Helps Cub Scouts advance through Cub Scout ranks.
- Encourages Cub Scouts to join a Boy Scouts troop upon graduation.
- Attends a certain number of den/pack meetings.
- Assists with activities in the weekly den meetings and monthly pack meetings.
- Meets with adult members of the den, pack, and troop as necessary.
- Is a friend to the boys in the den.
- Sets a good example.
- Enthusiastically, consistently, and correctly wears the Scout uniform.
- Lives by the Scout Oath and Law.
- Shows Scout Spirit.
- At the end of his term, passes all relevant records, material, information, and advice to the newly appointed Den Leader.

Prerequisites:

- The Scout must at least be first-class rank.
- Should have completed BSA junior leader training (JLT) course.

Expectations:

If not satisfactorily performing his duties (as determined by Scoutmaster and Assistant scoutmasters) due to poor attendance or lack of attention to responsibilities, can lose his position and not receive credit for a "position of responsibility."
