The Boy Scouts of America, founded in 1910, is the realization in the United States of the international Boy Scout movement begun by Sir Robert Baden-Powell in England in 1906. In the US, 2.5 million people participate in scouting units. Scouting worldwide is a 30 million strong youth movement dedicated to development of character, self-reliance, responsibility, physical fitness and the skills of citizenship in young men and women. It is also a lot of adventure and great fun!

Of every 100 boys that join a Scout troop it is estimated that eighteen will develop hobbies that will last through their adult life, one will use his Boy Scout skills to save a life, one will use his Boy Scout skills to save his own life, and two will become Eagle Scouts - the highest rank attainable.

Fun and adventure in outdoor activities are central to the Scouting philosophy. Cub Scouts is for younger boys and Boy Scouts is for older boys. The aims of the Scouting movement worldwide are summarized by the Scout Oath and Law.

SCOUT OATH: On my honor, I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law. To help other people at all times, to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake and morally straight.

SCOUT LAW: A Scout is Trustworthy, Loyal, Helpful, Friendly, Courteous, Kind, Obedient, Cheerful, Thrifty, Brave, Clean, and Reverend
